Discussion was held relating to the Director of Economic Development position. Also discussed was the need to hold performance reviews with all Department Heads. Anfinson stated that as the Chairperson of Personnel & Finance and he will guarantee Department Heads receive performance reviews by the end of January 2017.

Motion by Fausett, second by Hady, to reconsider Ordinance 2016-13, An Ordinance Adopting the 2017 Budget and the 2016 Tax Levy for the City of Horicon.

Vote on above motion.

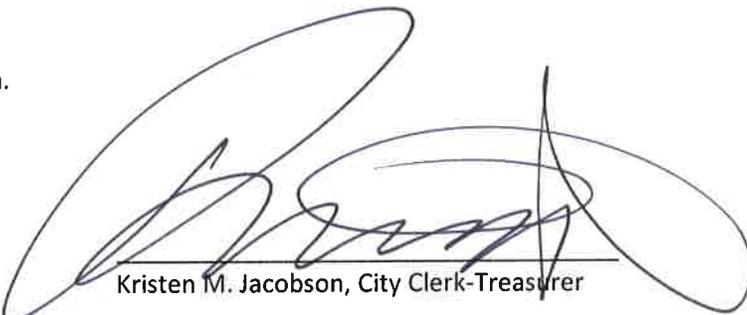

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-13

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE 2017 BUDGET AND THE 2016 TAX LEVY FOR THE CITY OF HORICON.

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HORICON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the receipts of the City of Horicon for the year 2017, including monies received from the general property tax levy, to the various purposes specified in the budget presented herewith for the purposes therein stated, the following amounts as set forth in Exhibit A.

Section 2. That the City Budget for 2017, calling for a tax levy of \$2,172,502.00 be adopted.

Section 3. There is hereby levied a tax of \$2,172,502.00, prior to calculating TIF increment, on all taxable property within the City of Horicon as returned by the assessor in the year 2015, for the uses and purposes set forth in the budget.

Section 4. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to spread this tax on the current tax roll of the City of Horicon.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be enforced from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.

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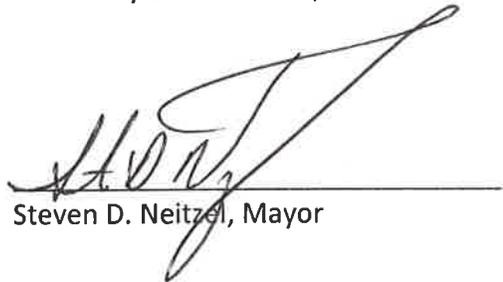
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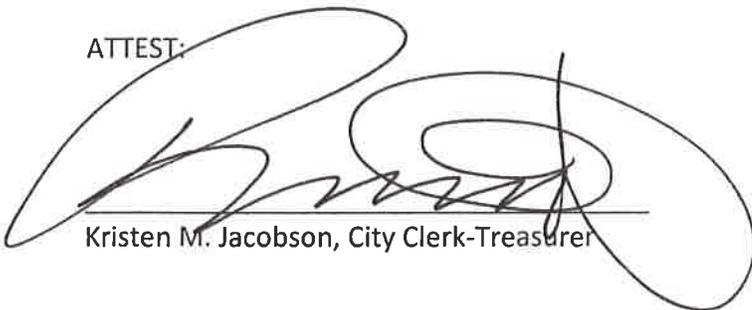
