


Infant Seat


BABIES UNDER 1 YEAR OLD **AND** 20 POUNDS
MUST USE A REAR FACING CAR SEAT



- **The seat should be installed at a 30 to 45 degree angle**
- **If the position of the seat is at an upright angle, the child's head may tip forward and obstruct breathing**


Rear-Facing Convertible Seat



- American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that children stay rear facing until 2 years of age or to the highest weight allowed by the manufacturer of the seat.

Forward-Facing Seat




- **Use the top tether strap (refer to car manual for proper placement)**
- **If combined weight of the seat and child reaches 65 pounds or greater the seat should be installed using the seatbelt and not the lower anchors**

Belt Positioning Booster Seat

Child must be at least 4 years old **and** 40 pounds



The shoulder strap is snug across the chest

The top of the child's ears are below the top of the vehicle headrest

Always use the lap and shoulder belt with booster seats

The lap belt is snug across the upper thigh

Use a booster seat until one of the following:

1. 8 years old **or**
2. 80 pounds **or**
3. 4 foot 9 inches tall
