

The Public Works and Development Committee meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Chairman Don Miller.

Members Present: Miller, Bandsma and Vanderhei.

Members Absent: None.

Motion by Miller, second by Bandsma, to approve the minutes for June 10, 2021.
All voting Aye. Motion carried.

Blue Zones:

- Applying for the Silver Healthy Community Level for the City, to include the Healthy School Lunch Program.
- Five-year comp plan, No Smoking Ordinance.
- Looking into a BDCH Grant for Safe School Route Crossing, share car/bike route on Gray Street.

Recommend to Council to approve second 16-foot-wide driveway at 205 Kansas Street, this will be at homeowner's expense.

Kingman asking for a Budget Amendment, not to exceed in the amount of \$2,000.00 for replacement of chemical tank and level sensor at Well #4.

Looking to approve the cost of blacktopping W. Walnut Street, Oak Hill Cemetery and DPW shop in the amount of \$36,995.00.

Looking to replace the truck injectors in the amount of \$5,000.

DPW Updates:

- 2021 Sidewalk Replacement Projects are in progress, will continue as sidewalks are replaced.
- East Lake Street Construction is complete; reopened the street June 30th.
- Kansas Street Project is moving along nicely. Utility tie-in and underground work is completed. storm sewer and road construction will continue.
- Tree trimming/removal and stump grinding is complete.
- Van Brunt housing is complete, occupancy permit has been issued. The remaining sidewalk, road signs, and site clean-up to be finished.
- Working on weed control at R.R. property.

Water/Wastewater Updates:

- Rare Earth chemical is being applied and we are between 0.3 – 0.4 mg/L Phosphorus.
- Sewer cleaning has started.
- Chemical pump improvements for Well #4 has been approved by the DNR.
- Verizon monopole to be installed late July.
- Well #4 VFD and flowmeter equipment has been installed and calibrated.
- Working with US Cellular on painting of the Eagle Hill water tower, will continue as weather permits.
- PFAS testing show the city measurements between 20-25 ppt. The state level is 30-40 ppt.
- There was a significant increase in John Deere sewer load for June. No reason for this has been found so far.
