

ORDINANCE NO. 2011-13

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND RECREATING SECTION 10-1-28(a) OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF HORICON

The Common Council of the City of Horicon, Wisconsin does ordain as follows:

Section 10-1-28(a) regarding Winter Parking Prohibitions of the Municipal Code of the City of Horicon is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

**10-1-28(a) Winter Parking Prohibitions.** When signs have been erected at or reasonably near the corporate City limits, as provided in Sec. 349.13, Wis. Stats., no owner or operator of any motor vehicle shall park upon any public street or alley during the hours of 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. from Dec 1 to March 31. Temporary parking may be approved by the Police Department.


An overnight winter parking permit from Dec 1 to March 31, to park on a public street, when a snow emergency or snow event does not exist (Section 10-1-21, 10-1-28d and 10-1-28e), may be applied for at City Hall. A non-refundable fee, determined by the City Council, will be required per permit. Overnight winter parking permits are subject to the street abutting a specific address and expire April 1 each year.

- (c) **Parking Permit Required.** No person shall park or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, and whether temporarily or otherwise, in an area requiring a parking permit as designated by an official traffic sign, unless that vehicle has displayed upon the left front area of the vehicle's dash a current parking permit issued by the City of Horicon.

### **Sec. 10-1-21 Parking Restrictions During Temporary Snow Removal or Street Maintenance.**

- (a) **Street Maintenance.** Whenever it is necessary to clear or repair a City roadway or any part thereof, the Director of Public Works and/or Police Department shall post such highways or parts thereof with signs bearing the words "No Parking." Such signs shall be erected at least two (2) hours prior to the time that street maintenance work is to be commenced. No person shall park a motor vehicle in violation of such signs.
- (b) **Temporary Parking Restrictions for Special Events.** Pursuant to the provisions of Subsection 349.13, Wis. Stats., the Chief of Police is authorized to direct that temporary "No Parking" signs be erected by the Director of Public Works during parades, festivals and other authorized events that require the regulating of vehicle stopping, standing or parking on City roadways. The temporary regulation shall be limited to the time the event exists or is likely to exist.

### **Sec. 10-1-22 Stopping or Parking Prohibited in Certain Places.**

- (a) **Parking Prohibited.** No person shall stop, park or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended and whether temporarily or otherwise, in any of the following places:
- (1) Within an intersection.
  - (2) On a crosswalk.
  - (3) On a sidewalk or terrace area, except when parking in such place is clearly indicated by official traffic signs or markers or parking meters. "Terrace or Sidewalk Area" means that area between the sidewalk and the nearest curb line running parallel or generally parallel thereto or in the absence of a sidewalk ten (10) feet beyond the curb line.
  - (4) Alongside or opposite any highway excavation or obstruction when such stopping or standing would obstruct traffic or when pedestrian traffic would be required to travel in the roadway.
  - (5) On the roadway side of any parked vehicle unless double parking is clearly indicated by official traffic signs or markers.
  - (6) Within twenty (20) feet of the driveway entrance to a fire station.
